4.b. Round table Discussion:

Rod Hunchak - Airport: At the end of April, Swoop will be flying between Winnipeg and Victoria. The flight is seasonal for 5 months during summer. Victoria Distillers will be opening in the lower hold room as part of phase 2. Councillor Rintoul commended the Airport for incorporating local service providers. The large mounds of earth at the end of the runway will be there another one to two years.

Deanna Mathewson – Shaw Ocean Discovery Centre: The Centre saw a very good end of year. Today is the end of the 5-day closure for maintenance. A new retail manager is coming later this month. The Centre is working in conjunction with Beaty Biodiversity Museum from Vancouver on a new exhibit for the spring,

which will focus on Takaya the lone wolf who lives on a small island near Victoria. The centre is also growing sweet kelp in conjunction with Cascadia Seaweed.

Denny Warner – Saanich Peninsula Chamber of Commerce: The Chamber is currently working with the BIA to resolve the taxi issues around town. They have been in discussions with Wilsons Transportation who will be coming back with options and costs.

Stasia Hartley - Homecare. Stasia is the *Breakfast to Remember* Chair, a fundraiser for the Alzheimer's Society to be held at the Empress Hotel on Thursday, February 27. The keynote speaker is Gregory Marshall and the event will have a marine focus. Stasia will be out of town for the February 14 and March 13 meetings. Paula will arrange for her to conference call into the meetings.

Alyssa Gerwing - SEAG has not me yet this year. The Museum will have family day's events in February and the LEGO exhibit is doing well.

Doug Walker - home-based business: Doug is looking forward to the home office workshop being put on by the Chamber.

Annilee Armstrong: nothing to report

Barbara Cina – Bistro Swiss: Business has been good. She has been thinking of parking issues downtown and suggested angle parking could be introduced by reducing Beacon Avenue to one lane or converting the area to pedestrian friendly.

David Calveley – member at large: Just prior to Christmas, David attended a business conference between Vienna and Southern Germany. He reported that everyone knew about this part of the world.

Chad Rintoul – Councillor: South Island Prosperity Project (SIPP) is doing a presentation to Council on Monday regarding funding renewal. He suggested that in the future the EAC may want to invite SIPP to an EAC meeting.

Natalie King – Sidney Pier Hotel/BIA: The BIA is meeting next Wednesday. From the hotel perspective, Haro's and Georgia Café have sold to 10 Acres. They are currently in the process of a major renovation of the restaurant which should reopen mid-March. January has been the slowest January for the hotel in 5 years. Downtown Victoria is the same. Overall, the market is softening around the region, including Vancouver.

Andrew Hicik advised that the 2020 budget is being presented to Council and the public on January 20th.

- In 1983 we expanded to include the District of Central Saanich & became the Saanich Peninsula Chamber of Commerce







Membership by Sector
