Reporting to the Director of Community Planning, this position will focus on the development, implementation, and maintenance of municipal planning activities with a dual focus on long-range planning initiatives and climate action projects that lead to the reduction of GHG emissions, climate change mitigation and climate change adaptation in Sidney. Key tasks for the position will be to assist in the development and implementation of planning documents that support these goals, including the Town's Official Community Plan, Zoning Bylaw, Economic Development Plan, and the Climate Action Plan. This position may also be responsible for supporting broader capacity-building and knowledge-sharing activities and deliverables, as required.

This position requires time management and organizational skills to work effectively in a busy office environment. Strong communication and interpersonal skills are required to facilitate interdepartment information sharing, collaboration, and project assistance. The ability to work in a teamoriented environment and maintain effective working relationships with stakeholders is required.

To be considered for this position, applicants should have the following qualifications:

- Post secondary education in planning, environment, sustainability, or science.
- Minimum of 2 years' experience in a local government planning environment with experience in climate action and/or adaptation or sustainability initiatives.
- Demonstrated understanding of climate change issues and sustainable development within the context of municipal government.
- Eligible for membership in Planning Institute of British Columbia (PIBC) and the Canadian Institute of Planners (CIP).
- Possession of a valid class 5 B.C. Drivers' License.

Legally able to work in Canada is a requirement of this position.

- Equivalent combination of training and experience.
